Main Job Purpose

CARE Egypt has been selected by UNHCR to develop a program addressing sexual and gender based violence (SGBV) among refugees in terms of prevention and response. Under prevention the psychologist will be expected to give awareness sessions around SGBV.

Under response CARE Egypt has a case management unit that supports survivors based on the four pillars of protection: legal- health- psychosocial and safety.

The psychologist is expected to empower and give the support needed by refugees SGBV clients. Psychologist should have the skills and/or knowledge to work with refugee or similar groups including adults and children in addition to being familiar to working on SGBV. Psychologist will be expected to visit the closest CBO/NGO to the persons of concern to conduct counselling sessions.

Psychologist must be sensitive towards cultural boundaries in general and understanding to SGBV refugee community's circumstances in specific. The case managers also assist him/her with logistics and other actions needed to allow both one-on-one sessions and group support activities to take place.

He/she will be expected to submit brief reports about each client, in which the format will be set in coordination with case managers.

Objectives

- Conduct counselling sessions for refugees who have been subject to SGBV.
- Provides ideas for group activities when needed.
Suggest ideas for further interventions needed to improve the well-being of a refugee.
- Implement awareness raising sessions around SGBV

Accountabilities

- Conduct one-on-one sessions with refugee adults and/or children (caseload is decided with the case management supervisors)
- Share feedback about cases with case managers (with respect to client confidentiality) to assist case managers to reconsider their action plans if needed.
- Maintain clear, comprehensive, and accurate records of all clients. Brief reports about the cases served, and that highlight challenges, achievements, and lessons learned to further feed into the case management process.
- Create an evaluation system to measure the cases' amelioration.
- Assist case managers to create group activities when needed to maintain the sustainability of individual psychosocial well-being.
- To develop and implement awareness raising sessions and psychosocial activities for refugees around SGBV.
